These release notes provide information about the One Identity Starling Two-Factor Desktop Login release.

About this release

One Identity Starling Two-Factor Desktop Login offers companies and organizations the ability to add strong Two-Factor Authentication to Microsoft's Windows client and server operating systems. It provides a simple and consistent login experience, even when the user logs in to the local desktop or through a terminal session. Starling Two-Factor Desktop Login ensures secured identity by requiring users to provide their Starling Two-Factor one-time password during the login process.

New features

New features in Starling Two-Factor Desktop Login 1.1:

- Support for TLS v1.2
- When Starling Two-Factor Desktop Login sends the push notification, the push notification details contains the computer name instead of the IP address.
- Support for Windows Server 2019
- Ability to allow local users to bypass Starling Two-Factor Authentication.

 Ability to select or type any Active Directory attributes in the E-Mail attribute or Phone number attribute dropdown menu.

Resolved Issue	Issue ID
When you use Starling Two-Factor Desktop Login to log into a machine with an invalid credentials (user name and password) followed by a valid credentials, second factor authentication for the latter user is bypassed.	216935
When you use Starling Two-Factor Desktop Login to log into a machine with a valid user name and an empty password, Push notification is triggered without password validation.	225741
